What is Early Head Start?

Early Head Start (EHS) is a federally funded, community-based program for low-income families with infants and toddlers and pregnant women. Its mission is simple:

- to promote healthy prenatal outcomes for pregnant women,
- to enhance the development of very young children, and
- to promote healthy family functioning.

Early Head Start is dedicated to protecting and strengthening the bonds between parents and children. During their first three years of life, a child's brain is developing the pathways (connections between brain cells) which will imprint the way they learn, move, and interact socially for the rest of their lives. How parents interact with their children in those first three years can have lasting effects on the child's development. Benefits for Children:

- Learn to express thoughts and feelings
- Increased self-confidence
- Positive relationships with other children
- Develop literacy and math skills

Early Head Start Program Options

Full-Day Center Based

(Parents must be employed or in school/training with no caregiver in the home.)

- 4 months to 3 years old
- 5 days per week
- Parent transport
- Fees apply
- Child Care Assistance required

Home Based

- Prenatal to 3 years old
- Weekly home visits with trained parent educator
- Group socialization activities for parents and children twice per month.
- No cost for services
